Remote examination rules

Course materials

- The course materials are:
 - anything that was placed on Learn;
 - o any recommended textbooks;
 - o and your own notes prepared before the examination.
- For this examination, it is assumed that you have full access to the course materials.
- Results from course materials do not need to be referenced except where necessary for clarity.

Other written or internet sources

- We do not expect these will be very helpful. The exams are for you to demonstrate your understanding of the course material.
- Material copied from (or adapted from) sources other than the course materials must be cited and referenced. This includes material obtained from interactive websites or mobile apps. Failing to do so constitutes plagiarism and is an *offence under University regulations*
- Examiners may give little or no credit for material which has been derived from sources other than course materials *even if it has been cited and referenced*.
- For the above reasons, it is recommended that you do not spend time in the examination searching for relevant content other than in the course materials.

Communications

- You should read and take full note of the own work declaration on the following page: by submitting your solutions you agree to abide by the statements made within it
- In particular, it is an offence under University regulations to communicate with another person (whether a student on the course or not) during the period of the examination
